NY Classical creates and reinvigorates audiences for the theatre by presenting free productions of popular and forgotten classical plays in public spaces throughout New York City. We are also committed to developing and producing new plays by living playwrights that enrich and expand our understanding of what defines a classic.

We believe that everyone—regardless of social, economic, or educational background—should have the opportunity to enjoy live professional theatre together as a community. Since 2000, NY Classical has presented over 800 free performances for nearly 300,000 New Yorkers—and over 60% of our funding comes from individual donors like you!

To date, we have staged 45 all-free productions by playwrights including Shakespeare, Aphra Behn, Molière, Sheridan, Marivaux, Chekhov, Farquhar, Shaw, Alfred Jarry, Friedrich Schiller, Oscar Wilde, and Alice Scovell.

If you're just joining us...

The Wars of the Roses—the great English civil war between the great Houses of York (white rose) and Lancaster (red rose)—has just come to its bloody end when the ambitious and aggrieved Richard, Duke of Gloucester, killed Lancastrian King Henry VI and delivered the crown to the House of York.

Now third in line to the throne, only Richard's eldest brother, King Edward IV, Edward's son, the young Prince Edward, and their middle brother, Clarence, stand in his way.

After describing himself as unlovable, Richard concocts a plan to gain the crown first by marrying the recently widowed Lady Anne, daughter-in-law to King Henry VI (a nearly impossible feat—as she hates Richard and is from the House of Lancaster) and then by facilitating the murder of Clarence for treason (also difficult, given that King Edward, has recently pardoned him).

The Duchess of York, Richard's mother, is onto his tricks and ambitions but is powerless to stop his rise to power.

What will happen to King Edward's wife, Queen Elizabeth, and their children?

Why does the Earl of Buckingham become the kingmaker? And will he last?

Will Lords Hastings (the Lord Chamberlain) and Stanley (Earl of Derby) be able to thwart Richard's plan?
